

Would you like to get published but are not sure how to do so? Whether you have formal research training or work in a clinical setting, writing for professional journals can increase your professional impact and be personally fulfilling. Yet navigating the publications process, from submission through peer review and production, may seem daunting. This hands-on workshop will decode the process. Bring your ideas and, if possible, a 750-word draft. Presenters will work with a sample paper and walk the group through a typical peer-review process.

- Learn what to expect in peer review and how to interpret and respond to decision letters.
- Find out how to adapt and present your ideas for different formats.
- Break into small groups for specific critiques and guidance.
- Discuss publication ideas with a *PS* board member or column editor and outline steps to prepare material for publication.
